

A short refresher on what to record on your scorecard under certain circumstances

- Maximum Score for Handicap Posting Purposes (“Net Double Bogey”)
- Most Likely Score
- Net Par

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Maximum Score for Handicap Posting Purposes

Net Double Bogey = Par + 2 + Handicap strokes received on a hole (pops)

Par	+	Two Strokes (Double Bogey)	+	Stroke(s) Received	=	Max
4		2		1		7



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Where do you get your pops

- The stroke index/handicap row on the scorecard identifies the order in which your handicap strokes are received
- Player A with a Playing Handicap of 10 will receive pops on holes allocated 1 through 10 on the stroke index/handicap line of the scorecard
 - the hole with a stroke index/handicap of 1 is the hardest
 - the hole with a stroke index/handicap of 18 is the easiest
- Player B with a Playing Handicap of 24 will receive 1 pop on every hole + a 2nd pop on holes allocated 1 through 6
- If you enter your hole-by-hole scores into Golf Genius or the GHIN posting program, the software will automatically adjust any hole score so as not to exceed net double bogey

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What if the scorecard isn't popped?

- Our scorecards show all 27 holes with Ladies' Handicap numbered 1-9 for each nine
- When determining where you get your pops
 - the front 9 are the odd numbered holes
 - the back 9 are the even numbered holes
 - playing Tucson/Catalina, T3 is the hardest; C5 is the 2nd hardest; T6 is the 3rd hardest, etc.

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Most Likely Score

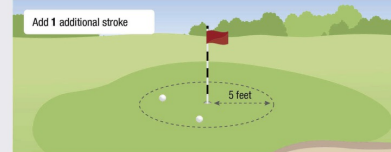
When you start, but do not finish a hole (for example, if you're out of the hole in a team or partner game), the **Most Likely Score** is based on the distance from the hole:

- 5 feet or less = **1** additional stroke
- between 5 feet and 20 yards = **2** or **3** additional strokes*
- more than 20 yards = **3** or **4** additional strokes*
- but it cannot exceed net double bogey

* This depends on the position of the ball, difficulty of the green and ability of the player

DIAGRAM 3.3: MOST LIKELY SCORE WHEN A HOLE IS STARTED BUT PLAYER DOES NOT HOLE OUT

▼ If the ball lies on the putting green, no more than 5 feet (1.5 metres) from the hole.



▼ If the ball lies between 5 feet (1.5 metres) and 20 yards (20 metres) from the hole.



▼ If the ball lies more than 20 yards (20 metres) from the hole.



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Net Par

- When a player does not play a hole, the score recorded for handicap posting purposes is **net par**
- Net Par = par + “pops” for that hole
 - if a player gets 2 pops on SaddleBrooke 7 (par 4)
 - Net Par is 6
- Situations where net par might be used:
 - stopping after finishing at least 14 holes (necessary because an 18-hole score must be posted)
 - skipping a hole
 - not playing a hole because it has been declared out of play by the Committee for maintenance or reconstruction purposes

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
