The nominations will be announced at the November General Meeting.

Maire Ryan talked about the rules and options for SB 2 (in light of Cactus Classic Tournament coming up). She noted that vegetation has been removed from the right side of the hole so it is much easier to see where a ball entered the hazard. If the ball goes in the hazard (water), the player may, under the penalty of one stroke: a) re-tee from the appropriate tee box; or b) take a drop in the drop area, near the aqua tee box.

If the player has a question regarding a rule in a stroke play event, please refer to Rule 3-3 in the Rules of Golf handbook.

Rule 11-4. Playing from Outside Teeing Ground

b. Stroke Play - If a competitor, when starting a hole, plays a ball from outside the teeing ground, she incurs a penalty of two strokes and must then play a ball from within the teeing ground.

If the competitor makes a stroke from the next teeing ground without first correcting his mistake or, in the case of the last hole of the round, leaves the putting green without first declaring his intention to correct this mistake, he is disqualified.

Rule 11-5. Playing from Wrong Teeing Ground The provisions of Rule 11-4 apply.

Our local rule for accidental movement of ball on green – no penalty.

Nancy Huffman thanked everyone for returning their piggy banks. A representative from Spirit West will be attending our luncheon at the December General Meeting. They will match monies from the banks and all donations will go to the local chapter of MS. If you forgot to bring along your banks, you may do so at the next meeting or get them to Nancy.
